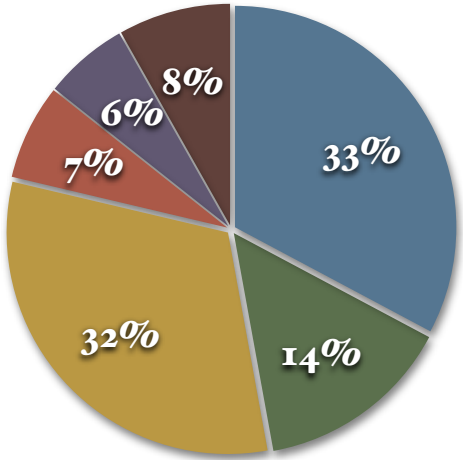

The Minsk Family Home is a residential program teaching graduate orphans life skills in a family setting. Currently, five young ladies live at the MFH.

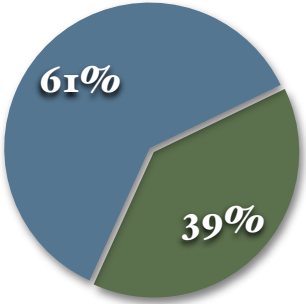

Residents contribute an average of \$35 each month. This enhances the participation of each by having her contribute to the program.

Discipleship

Regular worship in church is a requirement for the girls at the home. They also have the opportunity to complete six basic lessons in Christianity. Afterward, there's a basic course in Christianity, a sort of "Beginners School" for new believers. On Mondays, they have 'home group'. which includes Bible Study, prayer and fellowship. Finally, there is at least one other opportunity in the week to have Bible study time with a study guide and video.

Ministry

The girls are involved in the Spring of Revival orphan ministry – serving in shelters and participating in programs at orphanages. They function as role models for other orphans. Learning to minister to others is a key component of the Minsk Family Home.

Prayer Requests

Pray for the girls' academic support, physical health and spiritual growth. All the girls come from homes that are broken and dysfunctional, so pray for their integration into "family life" in MFH. Pray that they'll experience healing, and they'll learn to love and trust others as they understand God's love and forgiveness in their own lives. Pray that their experience in the MFH will help prepare them for life as independent young adults.
